

Notes for Contributors

Independent Nurse, published by Mark Allen Healthcare, is a magazine for nurses who work in primary care and the community. The clinical content is aimed towards those taking on advanced roles, nurse practitioners and prescribers.

Contributors should assume an appropriate baseline level of knowledge among readers. When writing, adopt a clear, direct style and where appropriate leave the reader with clear 'take-home messages' to influence practice.

Important notes

Articles should aim to be no more than 800 or 1400 words (not including references), depending on which has been commissioned.

Independent Nurse does not guarantee publication for any article unseen and reserves the right to edit articles as necessary.

Articles should be submitted exclusively to *Independent Nurse*.

All contributors are required to return a signed copyright agreement (with Mark Allen Healthcare) prior to publication.

A complimentary copy of the magazine will be sent to each listed author on publication.

Preparing your article for the clinical features section

First page – the first page of the article should give the title of the article, with the name, qualifications, job title and place of work of the author(s) as you wish them to appear in the magazine.

Technical terms – drugs should be referred to by their approved, non-proprietary names; scientific measurements should be given in SI units, except for blood pressure, which should be expressed in mmHg; numbers below 10 are spelled out, except for measurements used with a unit.

Boxes / tables – we encourage the use of boxes and tables as they enhance the appearance of articles and help the reader retain information presented. Place boxes and tables at the end of the main text and mention them in the body of the text to indicate where they should appear, e.g. (see Box 3).

References – please use amended Vancouver style (see below) and keep references to a minimum – no more than five per 500 words of requested text. (Do not count references as part of the total number of words requested.)

References should be numbered in the order in which they appear in the text and listed in full at the end of the article (not as footnotes). Details for each reference should follow the Vancouver style. Please give names and initials of the first author followed by et al (unless there are

two, when both names should be given).

The authors' names are followed by: article title; journal title abbreviated according to Index Medicus (*see: www.nlm.nih.gov*); year of publication; volume number; first and last page numbers.

References to books should give the names of any editors, place of publication, editor, and year.

Information from manuscripts not yet in press, papers reported at meetings, or personal communications should be cited only in the text, not as a formal reference.

Authors should obtain permission from the source to cite personal communications.
